## Quick guide

Textbooks and readings are the essential sources that your topic coordinator has carefully chosen to help you learn about the topic. These may be books, journal articles, book chapters, videos, podcasts, reports, etc.

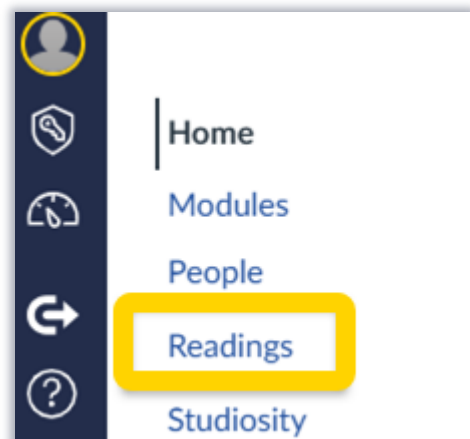
The Readings list in FLO is one way for you to find and access these sources.

## The Reading List in FLO

Once you're in your FLO topic, look for the link to **Readings** on the left-hand side menu.

The readings list will open in a new tab. You may need to tell your browser to allow pop-up windows.

Readings lists allow you to click on links to see all the details and access options you have. The list will be organised in sections and set up by your topic coordinator.



You may find **View online** links that take you straight to the article, book or other online resource

If a print copy is available in the library, there will be a **shelf number/location**

There may also be other useful pieces of information on the list. Such as whether a reading is **Required** or if it has **simultaneous user limits**.
